He took great pride in Poets Park that he took on the role of volunteer park keeper and would open and close the park and would report damage to the Council parks team to make sure the park was kept in good order. The park over the years had a bit of a name for ASB.

After 10 years of lobbying the Council led by Brian and a few local residents and the Upper Horfield Community Trust, the park underwent a £117,000 revamp CCTV was installed and ASB is now almost unheard of.

When the park was reopened Brian was asked to do the opening and a plaque with his name and date of the opening was made by his friend and neighbour Mr Titch Renee for all his hard work in the community. Over the years the plaque faded and became unreadable, this is now going to be replaced by his sons so his long connection with Poets Park will not be forgotten.
